## 6. <u>Consideration Of And Action On Minutes</u>

#### a. <u>Regular Meeting March 26, 2020</u>

Mayor Pro-Tem Aldrich moved to approve the minutes of March 26, 2020; seconded by Council Member Apodaca. The motion carried with a 5-0-1 vote.

# c. <u>2019 Annual Racial Profiling Report Presentation, Police Chief Kevin Bois</u>

## d. <u>City Of Kirby Curfew Ordinance Presentation, Police Chief Kevin Bois</u>

## 8. Discussion And Possible Actions

a. <u>Discussion And Possible Action To Award A Contract For 2020 Peppermint</u> <u>Elevated Water Storage Tank Painting And Repairs</u>

Council Member Grant moved to award the contract for 2020 Peppermint Elevated Water Storage Tank painting and repairs to Tankez Coatings, Inc. in the amount of \$316,000; second by Mayor Pro-Tem Aldrich. The motion carried with a 7-0 vote.

b. <u>Discussion And Possible Action To Consider A Lease Agreement Between The City</u> Of Kirby And The Kirby Senior Center

City Manager Vernon provide the history of the lease agreement. The lease agreement is effective May 1, 2020 and ends April 30, 2025. After April 30, 2025, the lease shall continue on a month-to-month basis.

Senior Center Manager, Norma Hamby, did not have any questions or comments.

Council Member Grant moved to approve a lease agreement between the City of Kirby and the Kirby Senior Center with a fee of \$1.00 per year; seconded by Council Member Lehman. The motion carried with a 7-0 vote.

c. <u>Discussion And Possible Action On Ordinance No. O-2020-876 An Ordinance</u> <u>Amending The 2019-2020 Municipal Budgets Of The City Of Kirby. This Is The First</u> <u>Reading</u>. Tina Ynfante, Finance Director, provided an overview of the proposed amendment to the 2019-2020 Municipal Budgets. The General Fund beginning balance is \$1,940,979 and ending balance is \$1,119,997. The water fund beginning balance is \$5,791,448 and ending balance is \$5,268,568.

Council Member Grant moved to accept Ordinance No. 2020-876 an ordinance amending the 2019-2020 Municipal Budgets of the City of Kirby; seconded by Mayor Pro-Tem Aldrich. The motion carried with a 7-0 vote.

d. <u>Discussion And Possible Action To Dispense With The Second Reading Of</u> <u>Ordinance No. O-2020-876 So That Ordinance No. O-2020-876 Becomes Effective</u> <u>Immediately</u>.

Council Member Lehman moved to dispense with the second reading of Ordinance No. O-2020-876 so that Ordinance No. O-2020-876 becomes effective immediately; seconded by Council Member Grant. The motion carried with a 7-0 vote.

e. Discussion And Possible Action On Ordinance No. O-2020-877 An Ordinance Repealing Chapter 151 Of The Code Of Ordinances Of The City Of Kirby, Texas In Regard To Flood Damage Prevention, And Adopting New Chapter 151 Of The Code Of Ordinances Of The City Of Kirby In Regard To Flood Damage Prevention And Providing For A Penalty Of A Fine Of Not More Than \$500.00 For Each Violation (Plus Costs And Expenses) With Each Day A Violation Occurs To Constitute A Separate Offence. This Is The First Reading.

After discussion, Council Member Grant moved to accept Ordinance No. O-2020-877 an ordinance repealing Chapter 151 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Kirby, Texas in regard to flood damage prevention, and adopting new Chapter 151 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Kirby in regard to flood damage prevention and providing for a penalty of a fine of not more than \$500.00 for each violation (plus costs and expenses) with each day a violation occurs to constitute a separate offence; seconded by Council Member Lehman. The motion carried with a 7-0 vote.
