City Manager Vernon briefed City Council on the history of the Community Development Block Grant qualifying process. Bexar County Commissioners Court will have a public hearing to consider the applications and we plan to advertise the date and time of the public hearing. Residents are invited to attend the public hearing, sign up to speak and ask the Bexar County Commissioners to strongly consider funding this project for Kirby. If you are not able to attend you can write a letter to County Commissioner Tommy Calvert informing him of our need for the funding for our streets.

n <u>Discussion And Possible Action On 2429 Ackerman Road – Possible Executive</u> <u>Session Consultation Pursuant To Texas Government Code Section 551.071, With Attorney</u>

Mayor Pierce asked if there was anyone to speak on this item.

Ms. Nancy Pena said she owns the property and wants to open an insurance agency. Her office building will be a mobile office building which she has placed on the property. She has been informed that the zoning is not correct and would like to be in compliance by correcting the zoning.

Mr. Anthony Jetter explained that Landis is a private road and stated the lot size for this property is too small for the type of business she is trying to place on the lot.

Mayor Pierce closed the regular meeting at 8:00 P.M. to convene into an Executive Session consultation pursuant to Texas Government Code Section 551.071, with attorney on March 12, 2020.

Mayor Pierce state the Executive Session ended on March 12, 2020 at 8:37 P.M. and no action was taken. She reconvened the regular meeting at 8:41 P.M.

City Manager Vernon said informed Ms. Pena that she will contact her tomorrow regarding the next steps on her project.

Mr. Schnall addressed the concern raised earlier by Mr. Jetter regarding the property zone C-2 District. After reviewing documents received earlier today regarding the zoning, Mr. Schnall determined that the property is grand-fathered under the size and area requirements and setback requirements from the old B-1 and B-3 Districts. The front setback was 25 feet and side setback was 10 feet. Those are the same setbacks that exist in the current C-2 District.

Council Member Grant – He said the Annual Easter Egg Hunt will be held on April 5. There are 5,000 plastic eggs and candy is needed to fill them. This is a free event at Friendship Park and the Easter Bunny will be attending, too.
