5. <u>Citizen Participation</u>

a. <u>Emergency Medical Services Week Proclamation</u>

Mayor Aldrich presented the Kirby Fire Department personnel with the Emergency Medical Services Week Proclamation.

8. <u>Public Hearing</u>

a. On A Request For A Specific Use Permit For The Property Located At CB 4018G (SPRINGFIELD INDUSTRIAL PARK), Lot 4, Otherwise Known As 1440 Springfield Road, Kirby, TX 78219, Which Is Zoned Light Industrial (LI) To Be Used For The Following Purpose: Constructing Offices And Warehouses To Rent To Different Trades.

Mayor Aldrich opened the public hearing at 7:38 P.M.

- 1. Sharon Shuler She asked many questions regarding the building, hazardous materials, fence, utility easement, renters, hours of operation, and concerned about crime.
- 2. Lisa Pierce She asked Council to consider what Ms. Shuler said. What types of businesses will be going in and out. She said she supports business coming in and suggested Council set stipulations on the type of businesses that can go in.
 - 3. Harold Shaw He said he is concerned about drainage, rats, and possums.
- 4. Mr. Thomas Springfield Road cannot maintain the traffic and drainage concerns.
- 5. Charlene Wyatt She said that Springfield Road is the responsibility of San Antonio. Also, be cautious of the underground pipelines.
 - b. On A Request For A Variance To The Zoning Ordinance Single Family Dwelling District (R-1), Section 153.016(B)(8) Maximum Accessory Building Coverage Of Rear Yard: 30%; Section 153.059 Accessory Buildings And Carports To Consider Allowing An Existing Carport Located at CB 4018A, BLK 23, Lot 13, Otherwise Known As 5127 Starfire, Kirby, TX 78219.
- 1. Stephen Pitmon He had concerns with the building, permits were not issued and plans were never submitted.
 - 2. Ms. Bilke She was concerned about trash and heavy-duty trucks in the area.
 - 3. Lisa Pierce She spoke against this item.

- 4. Ms. Karina Medrano, property owner, spoke about property and said she was notified to obtain a permit by the police. She said the trash in the area was not from her property. Not her trash.
- 5. Mr. Wendell He said the occupant started the business without permits. He said he is opposed to the request.
 - c. On A Request For A Specific Use Permit To Allow Roofing Material Processing (Business) And Consider Section 153.036(B)(4) Design Of Ingress And Egress At The Property Located at CB 4018A, BLK 23, Lot 13, Otherwise Known As 5127 Starfire, Kirby, TX 78219, Which Is Zoned Single Family Dwelling District (R-1).
 - Ms. Bilke She said this is a residential house and should not be rezoned.
- 2. Lisa Pierce She said she is opposed to the request. Industrial use doesn't belong in a residential area and the ingress/egress could be an issue.
- 3. Karina Medrano She said the bending machine doesn't make noise. Regarding music, that is heard on Saturday only. There are only three workers bending material.
 - 4. Patricia Mann She said she is opposed to the request.
- 5. Charlene Wyatt She said this is a residential area and they should have requested the Specific Use Permit before operating the business and variance before constructing the buildings.
 - 6. Celicia Garza She said this is a residence and not a good idea.
 - 7. Ms. Bilke She said permits are required for building before construction.

 - 1. Lisa Pierce She expressed her concern about whether or not this is a construction site.
 - 2. Clay Covin owner He said he is here to answer questions.

- 1. Dolores Darby She said vote no. This is not zoned for this use. She was concerned because it is located in front of Kirby Middle School.
- 2. Sharon Shuler She spoke from past experience and had many concerns and questions.
- 3. Norma Somari She said she is a substitute teacher at Kirby Middle School and said vote no. There will be children walking to and from school.

Mayor Pro-Tem Grant moved to accept Resolution No. R-2021-736 a Resolution appointing Darrell Dullnig as Judge of the Municipal Court of the City of Kirby, Texas for a two year term beginning June 1, 2021, setting the compensation of the judge of the municipal court, and setting the dates, time, and place for holding regular sessions of the Municipal Court of the City of Kirby, Texas; seconded by Council Member Martin.
