1. <u>Call Meeting to Order</u>

Mayor Aldrich called the meeting to order at 7:00 P.M.

2. Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag

Mayor Aldrich led the invocation and pledge of allegiance to the flag.

3. <u>Mission Statement</u>

5. <u>Citizen Participation</u>

- 1. Lee Anderson He asked Council to expedite needed repairs on Wheatland Road.
- 2. Debra Walczyk She informed Council she does not support Ordinance No. O-2021-903. She asked them to place this on the ballot or table the item and create a group to review the ordinance.
- 3. Patricia Mann She informed Council she supports Ordinance No. O-2021-903 and offered her reasons.
- 4. Jose Garcia He expressed what he has seen in the City the past few days and compliments the City for the street repairs. He said the department is doing a good job.
 - 5. Roger Romens He deferred to speak when 9 a. is discussed.
 - 6 Harold Shaw He spoke about Ordinance No. O-2021-903 and offered his reasons.
- 7. Lisa Pierce She spoke about Ordinance No. O-2021-903 and said the voters should decide if the qualifications should be updated. She advised Council to be careful with posting on social media.
- 8. Ron Badour He emailed a request for his comments to be read. City Secretary Cox read his email. He wrote, the ordinance being proposed regarding qualifications for city office almost mirrors the law currently in place for Texas state offices and he does not like either one of them. He offered the reasons and asked Council to place it on the next ballot and let the voters decide.
- 9. Gilbert Rodriguez He emailed a request for his comments to be read. City Secretary Cox read his email. He wrote, the City's future should not be left to councilmembers to decide, but the community as a whole should have that power. This ordinance should not pass because you are directly limiting or stopping citizens from being able to our part to better this community.
- 10. Chris Garza He emailed a request for his comments to be read. City Secretary Cox read his email. He wrote, he wanted to discuss the new ordinance that the majority on this council is trying to push through, and he would like to address how targeted it truly is, and how he thinks that it's an overreach of power by making him ineligible. He said the focuses should be on building community, free flow of ideas, helping each other, fixing our roads, fixing our infrastructure, bringing in businesses, looking towards the future of Kirby and doing things the right way. People deserve the right to vote for who they want.

She asked council to please stop choosing things for our city that we did not have an opportunity to vote for. She believes this is a personal attack on certain people who should be allowed to run for office. She felt like our city doesn't want to come together or see things improve. Best regards and lots of hope that one day we can all be welcomed.
- 13. Kim Stroud She emailed a request for her comments to be read. City Secretary Cox read her email. She wrote, she noticed that the city council is trying to put restriction on who can run for positions on the council. If the city council would spend their time and energy on improving Kirby instead of worrying about someone beating them in the next election maybe more would get accomplished. The council needs new blood and there should be term limits in order to bring new fresh ideas for the improvement of Kirby. If a person is a registered voter, that person should have the right to run for office.

Mayor Pro-Tem Grant moved to accept the Quarterly Investment Report For Period Ending June 30, 2021 and Quarterly Financial Report For Period Ending June 30, 2021; seconded by Council Member Salazar. The motion carried with a 7-0 vote.

8. Presentation

a. Police Chief Badge Pinning

Chief Roxanne Cardona was pinned by Sergeant Alonzo and Sergeant Scurlock and the Oath of Office was administered by the City Secretary.

b. Fire Prevention Week Proclamation

Chief Hilburn accepted the proclamation presented by Mayor Aldrich.

9. <u>General Discussion And Possible Action</u>

a. Discussion And Possible Action On Ordinance No. O-2021-903 An Ordinance Of The City Council Of The City Of Kirby, Texas, Amending Chapter 30 Of The Code Of Ordinances To Provide For Certain Qualifications For Candidates For Mayor Or For Places on the City Council Or To Serve In Places On The City Council Of The City Of Kirby. This Is The Second Reading.

Roger Romens - He spoke in about the ordinance and said it is a smear campaign.

Mayor Aldrich opened the item for discussion.

Council discussed this item. There was discussion in support and opposition of the ordinance.

Mayor Pro-Tem Grant moved to accept Ordinance No. O-2021-903 an Ordinance of the City Council of the City of Kirby, Texas, amending Chapter 30 of the Code of Ordinances to provide for certain qualifications for candidates for mayor or for places on the city council or to serve in places on the city council of the City of Kirby; seconded by Council Member Apodaca. The motion carried with a 4-3 vote.

b. <u>Discussion And Possible Action On Statements Of Qualifications On City Engineer</u> Services

City Manager Vernon stated the City received five submissions for City Engineer Services. A committee made up of City Manager Vernon, Public Works Director Ives and Council Member Martin reviewed the submissions and selected three to attend our meeting. They were Ford, Bain Medina Bain and Freeland Turk.

The companies had 10 minutes each to present their qualifications and answer questions. Council ranked each company 1, 2, or 3 based on qualifications and authorize the City Manager to negotiate a contract.

Mark Hill - Ford Engineering, Carl Bain - Bain Medina Bain and Thomas Turk - Freeland Turk Engineering presented their companies.

Mayor Pro-Tem Grant moved to rank Ford Engineering number one; seconded by Council member Apodaca. The motion failed with a 3-4 vote.

Council member Salazar moved to rank Bain Medina Bain number one; seconded by Council Member Martin. The motion carried with a 4-3 vote.

Mayor Pro-Tem Grant moved to rank Ford Engineering as number two; seconded by Council member Apodaca. The motion carried with a 4-3 vote.

AYES: 4 NAYES: 3 (Council Members Salazar, Grider and Street)

After ranking each company, the results are as follows: Bain McCrary Bain, Ford Engineering, Freeland Turk Engineering.

Mayor Pro-Tem Grant moved to authorize City Manager to negotiate a contract based on the ranking order; seconded by Council Member Salazar.

The motion carried with 7-0 vote.

City Manager Vernon will negotiate between Bain Medina Bain, Ford Engineering, and Freeland Turk Engineering for engineering services. She will start with Bain Medina Bain and if not able to negotiate a contract, then will contact Ford Engineering. If not able to negotiate a contract, then will contact Freeland Turk Engineering.

c. <u>Discussion And Possible Action On A Request For The City To Waive Fees For City Services And Use Of Friendship Park For The 2021 Braylon Nelson Walk On October 16, 2021</u>

Ms. Candice Matthews introduced Braylon Nelson to Council and shared the history of their request. He is a survivor of an accident that occurred in Kirby in 2011 leaving him paralyzed. The proceeds will fund a hospital bed that is in need of being replaced that insurance won't cover as well as a shower chair. The date of the event is October 16, 2021.

City Manager Vernon informed Council the total fees to be considered to waive is \$435.

John Houlton spoke from the audience and said he will pay for the security - \$150.

Council Member Apodaca moved to waive rental fees for City Services and use of Friendship Park for the 2021 Braylon Nelson Walk on October 16, 2021, seconded by Council Member Street. The motion carried with a 7-0 vote.

Council Member Salazar moved to appoint Stephanie Faulkner to the Crime Control and Prevention District Board, term ending September 2023; seconded by Council Member Grider. The motion carried with a 7-0 vote.

The Council discussed 503c organizations and Council Members serving on the Board.

g. <u>Update, Discussion And Possible Action On City Of Kirby 2021 Pool Season</u>

City Manager Vernon presented the final revenue and expense report for the 2021 Pool Season. Pool revenue: entry fee \$8,668.00; concession \$2,826.80; Dep (=/-) \$28.29; total revenue \$11,523.09. Expenses: concessions \$1,611.78; pool maintenance \$3,576.05. Profit/loss \$6,335.26

Mayor Aldrich called for a 10-minute recess at 9:38 P.M.

Mayor Aldrich reconvened the meeting at 9:48 P.M.

h. Discussion And Possible Action On American Rescue Plan Act Funds

City Manager Vernon informed Council the funds have been received. Allocated in the next budget is \$206,000 for essential worker pay. There was discussion about the funds being

allocated and who they should be allocated to. City Manager Vernon explained the City never shut down during COVID March 1, 2020 – June 2021. The City provided 100% service during this time.

Council Member Street suggested using \$100,000 toward all employees in the amount of \$2,000 for each full-time employee and \$1,000 for each part time employee who worked during the pandemic. The employee has to be currently employed.

Council Member Street moved to use ARPA funds for essential workers to pay all employees, in the amount of \$2,000 for each full time employee and \$1,000 for each part time employee who worked during the pandemic and the employee has to be currently employed; seconded by Council Member Salazar. The motion carried with a 7-0 vote.
