Mayor Pro-Tem Grant moved to appoint Simone Green to the Beautification and Recycle Committee term ending October 1, 2022; seconded by Council member Martin. The motion carried with a 7-0 vote.

City Manager Vernon expressed the City needs more flexibility when publishing City notices in the official City newspaper. She said currently our option is advertising once a week with Northside Herald. They have rigid time frames for submitting the notice to the newspaper. San Antonio Express News offers more days we can advertise and submit our notice. She offered a comparison of the cost difference. Council will consider flexibility vs cost.

Council offered comments addressing the pros and cons of designating a different official City newspaper.

Mayor Pro-Tem Grant and Council Member Grider requested this item. Council Member Grider stated currently, Council Member Street serves on the Economic Development Committee and on the Kirby Senior Center Corporation Board as a member, treasurer and Council liaison. Council Member Martin serves on the Senior Center Corporation Board.

There was discussion regarding Council Members serving on boards, commissions and committees. If current council members resign from boards, commissions and committees this would create a vacancy for citizens to apply to serve. The council members can volunteer to help.

Council Members Street and Martin spoke on their own behalf.

Council Member Salazar – He commented that all members of Council want the zipper machine, but we cannot afford it at this time and we do not have enough personnel to man it. He suggested using the effort to increase our boundary to the west.

Council Member Grider – She inquired about the status of Road Hog Co; October 30, 9:00 A.M. – 11:00 A.M. San Antonio Rugby Academy offering free clinic. October 26, 5:30 P.M. -7:30 P.M. Kirby Middle School Community Trunk or Treat. Regarding a road machine, January 22, 2022 set a goal to have the information and a plan how we are going to move forward with road improvements. She thanked staff for participating in GOVERNMENT 101 class. She urged residents to sign up and get involved. She will start an event once a month for residents to come and speak with her and exercise. The first event is November 1, 6:30 P.M. – 7:30 P.M. at Friendship Park to "Travel the Trail with Council." (Originally former Mayor Lisa Pierce's name for the event.) December 1 is the date for the next walk. It's an information setting to get to know each other. She agreed with Mr. Shaw and his ideas about the budget. Now that the ordinance is in place, Council needs to discuss how it will be implemented. She thanked all City staff and wished everyone a great weekend.

Mayor Pro-Tem Grant — He thanked everybody for who participated in National Night Out. Building is taking place on Springfield Road. He said he appreciated Council Member Grider's efforts for activities for youth. We need to find something all youth can participate in. We need to take care of our youth and City.

Council Member Street – She spoke about Judson ISD bond election on November 2. She attended Northeast Partnership luncheon today and this was discussed. She asked that holiday programs be placed on the City calendar. She thanked all city employees.

Council Member Apodaca – She thanked everyone for their unfailing attendance, thank you City employees. On October 17, 1:00 P.M. the VFW will have their Sunday Fun Day.
