5. Citizen Participation

- 1. Joe Ramon He said he is the Commander for VFW Post 2059 and provided his background with the VFW and stated their mission is taking care of veterans, their families and serving the community. He informed Council that he received a letter from Code Enforcement that states he has to stripe his parking lot and fix potholes and it will be inspected on December 14. He said they are struggling and are non-profit. A courtesy call would have been nice. He asked for more time to take care of the violations.
- 2. Sammy Smith He said he has owned 5723, 5725 and 5735 Seguin Road for 30 years. Code Compliance issued a notice to him to pave the road. He said he feels harassed because the City had a water leak and for three months across the street from his property and the water was running into the creek and the City didn't do anything to fix it. The notice also said the buildings needed to be painted. He said they are old buildings and he can't do what they want. It has been 30 years and he asked City Council to review this and help the small business people. He said he has clients in the building and the are hard working. He was trying to keep the rent down, but the taxes keep going up. He explained the expenses to bring his buildings to code is expensive. He asked City Council for help to get around code compliance.
- 3. Nick Babic He said he's from Who Knows Bar and Pour House and has the same problem Mr. Ramon and Mr. Smith mentioned. Another problem is the City amended sprinkler ordinance. The square footage was amended to 2,500 square feet. This will destroy the small businesses that cannot afford the cost to install the sprinkler system.
- 4. Nina Castillo She said Swann Lane is horrible due to so many potholes. She asked when are the streets going to be repaired?

b. <u>Discussion And Possible Action On Entering Into An Agreement With Greater Northeast Little League For The Use Of Land Owned By The City Of Kirby For Little League Baseball Athletic Functions</u>

Doug Wolfe, President of Greater Northeast Little League was present to answer questions. He responded to the following questions:

Do you have a license agreement and health department to check your products? Mr. Wolfe replied yes.

He was asked about his financials and questioned about there not being any taxes paid on the concessions. Mr. Wolfe said they did not collect taxes on concessions.

Do you pay Kirby for use of the electricity and water? Mr. Wolfe said they do not pay electricity and water. He stated they pay rent, labor and take care of their own maintenance Mr. Wolfe replied if GNELL pays for the utilities then no one else should have use of the utilities. There are not any separate meters. City Manager Vernon said the meter at Friendship Park is for all usage there is not a separate meter. Currently we don't have a mechanism to track one groups usage.

There was discussion regarding adding a separate meter to track usage for electricity and water.

City Manager Vernon replied and stated there has to be a specific meter for the water and the city would have to purchase a specific meter from CPS Energy for electric at specific locations to track them.

On the License Agreement #8 Maintenance (b) heavy equipment that Kirby will be operating. What type of equipment do we operate? Mr. Wolfe said GNELL never asked the City for assistance.

How much do you make a year for advertising and marketing? Mr. Wolfe said several thousand.

Council mentioned using the advertising funds GNELL receives to offset the cost of the electricity. This would eliminate the installation of a new electric meter.

How many fields do you lease? Mr. Wolfe said three.

How many children are signed up to play? Mr. Wolfe said 225. Numbers are down due to COVID.

City Manager Vernon said she will obtain the cost of the water and electric meters. Also, determine the amount of usage of water and electricity to consider including a lump sum fee in the annual fee. She will compare the usage when they are playing and when they are not playing. (During baseball season and off season.) Consider a percentage this year.

City Manager Vernon said if GNELL is not using the field other people can use field.

Council Member Walczyk moved to postpone this item until we get information from City Manager Vernon for further investigation about electricity, water and sales tax and those

C. Discussion And Direction On Ordinance No. O-2019-866 An Ordinance Of The City Of Kirby, Texas Amending Sections 150.15, 150.16, 150.27, 150.28, 150.32, 150.33, And 150.35 Of The City's Code Of Ordinances Relating To Building, Mechanical, Plumbing, Existing Building, Performance, And Fuel Gas Codes And Adding Sections 150.37, 150.38, And 150.39 Relating To 2018 International Fire Code, 2018 International Swimming Pool And Spa Code, And 2018 International Green Construction Code To The City's Code Of Ordinances To Adopt Certain 2018 International Codes And Standards, Establishing Certain Building Code And Building Related Regulations And Requirements, And Establishing A Penalty Of A Fine Of Not Less Than \$500 Nor More Than \$2,000 For Violations With Each Day A Violation Occurs Constituting A Separate Offense Regarding Automatic Sprinkler Systems For New Construction

Council Member Street said the City changed the sprinkler requirements in 2019. She said Kirby's ordinance does not recognize separate groups that are recognized in the International Fire Code. There are Groups A and A1, A2 A3 A4 A5, etc. for different sized buildings and different purposes for those buildings and the square footage that requires a sprinkler system depends on the use of the building. Our ordinance has the square footage at 2,500. She believed the point of putting this item on the agenda is to amend that size requirement to put it at the International Fire Code level which is what the City of San Antonio also uses. Kirby adopted the 2018 Codes with local amendments so that the difference is Kirby's ordinance has local amendments to several of the codes we actually started with 500 square feet. In 2019 Council voted to increase the square footage to 2,500 for certain ones in certain groups and 5,000 in other groups and researched the codes in several other cities. It is not conducive to retaining businesses here or bringing in new businesses. We should amend the ordinance to reflect 5,000 square feet for a restaurant, bar or anything in group A2 category.

Chief Hilburn spoke about the history of Council amending the ordinance in 2019 to change the square footage from 500 to 2,500. He concurred with Council Member Walczyk that the original code before 2018 the square footage was 10,000 in 2018 International Fire Code. He explained there would be combustible alcohol in the facilities.

There was discussion about the number of structure fires in the City as well as the response time. Chief Hilburn said between 8 – 9 structure fires this year.

City Manager Vernon said City Council adopted the Code with local amendments.

Council Member Street said it is not conducive to keeping or adding businesses, it's unreasonable.

Council Member Street said it's time to reexamine the regulations from the International Fire Code for businesses Group A & A2 recommendations.

Council requested the revisions to this ordinance be prepared.

d. <u>Discussion And Possible Action On City Cell Phones For Council Members</u>

Mayor Pro-Tem Grider said she requested this item because instead of using personal phones, city phones can be used for city business.

City Council discussed different plans and the cost of the plans.

Council Member Martin moved to purchase the lowest cost cell phone with the best rate; seconded by Council Member Walczyk. The motion carried with a 5-1 vote.

e. <u>Discussion And Direction On City Of Kirby Finances And Investments</u>

City Manager Vernon provided information on the promotional rates for additional Certificates of Deposits from Schertz Bank & Trust and rates from Texas Heritage Bank.

Council discussed the best investment for City funds.

The consensus of Council was to move three million dollars in one million dollar increments for one year CD's at 4.8 percent with Schertz Bank and Trust.

City Manager Vernon expressed the interest received will go toward the 2018 Street Bond funds because this is money from that project.

f. <u>Discussion And Possible Action To Appoint Member(s) To The Kirby Senior Center</u> Corporation Board

Council Member Walczyk said Council did not receive a signed code of conduct form from the applicants and she noted there were two applicants who lived together and are possibly related. The form needs to be signed before she will agree to an appointment.

Mayor Pro-Tem Grider said Council Member Walczyk is correct.

City Manager Vernon provided options that are available for the City Council Retreat. They also offer one on one sessions with Council Members prior to a half day Saturday workshop that included a personality assessment and an opportunity to work through team building activities. Our City attorney's office will charge their regular hourly rate.

Charlie Zech, City Attorney, said his firm does not offer team building retreats.

Mayor Pro-Tem Grider agreed that a team building retreat was needed.

Council Member Garza said if there is an hourly fee the use the Council Chamber for three to four hours to discuss grievances. He said he doesn't think a retreat/team building was the way to go. He suggested using the money to fix streets.

Mayor Pro-Tem Grider said there has to be some way work together. City Attorney Zech said there was another city that has an annual retreat.





§ 150.16 LOCAL AMENDMENTS TO BUILDING CODE.

Certain provisions and portions of the International Building Code, 2018 Edition, are hereby amended as they apply to activities within the City. The amendments to the International Building Code, 2018 Edition, are as follows:

(A) Sections 103.1 and 103.2 are amended to read as follows:

Section 103.1 Deleted.

Section 103.2 Building official.


The building official shall be appointed by the City Manager.


(B) Section 114.4 is amended to read as follows:


114.4. Violations; penalty.

Any person who shall violate a provision of the code adopted by this article, or fail to comply therewith, or with any of the requirements thereof, or who shall erect, construct, alter, demolish or move any structure, or has erected, constructed, altered, repaired, moved, or demolished a building or structure in violation of a detailed statement or drawing submitted and approved thereunder shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction of any such violation, such person shall be punished by a fine not to be *less than \$500 and not more than \$2,000*. The owner or owners of any building or premises or part thereof, where anything in violation of this article shall be placed or shall exist, and any architect, builder, contractor, agent, person or corporation employed in connection therewith and who may have assisted in the commission of any such violation shall be guilty of a separate offense and upon conviction shall be fined as herein provided. Each day a violation occurs shall be a separate offense.

- (C) Delete Section 903, replace with the following:
 - (1) Henceforth automatic sprinkler systems must be installed throughout all levels of all new Group A, B, E, F, H, I, M, R-1, R-2, R-4 and S occupancies as defined in the International Building Code (IBC) of more than 2,500 square feet and throughout all R-3 occupancies as defined in said International Building Code of more than 5,000 square feet. The calculated area shall include all habitable space as well as the area of attached garages or storage facilities. Such systems shall be in accordance with Section 903 of the International Building Code as well as National Fire Protection Association Standards 13D and 13R, 2002 edition, for single-family dwellings.
 - (2) The following exceptions are hereby established:
 - (a) Detached gazebos and armadas for residential and public use. Independent buildings such as restrooms or snack shops 400 square feet or less without cooking or heating appliances that are associated with golf courses, parks and similar uses.
 - (b) Detached noncombustible carports or shade canopies.
 - (c) Guardhouses that are less than 300 square feet in size and used to control access to or within residential and/or commercial developments.
 - (d) Detached equipment or storage buildings for commercial use not exceeding 250 square feet.
 - (e) Detached residential storage buildings or garages that are no inhabitable and not exceeding 1,000 square feet.
 - (f) Barns and agricultural buildings for private, residential, noncommercial use, and not exceeding 3,000 square feet.
 - (g) Detached noncombustible canopies used exclusively for automotive, motor-fuel dispensing stations for private passenger vehicles and not exceeding 5,000 square feet.





§ 153.017 "R-2" MULTI FAMILY DWELLING DISTRICT.

- (A) Use. Property in an "R-2" Multi-Family Dwelling District shall be used only for structures incorporating multiple dwelling units and incidental accessory uses.
- (B) Area requirements.
 - (1) Minimum lot area:
 - (a) The minimum lot area shall be 10,000 square feet for the first 3 dwellings units and each additional dwelling unit shall be a minimum of 3,630 square feet.
 - (b) No MF-2 Development shall exceed a density of more than 12 dwelling units per gross acre.
 - (2) Minimum lot frontage on a public street:
 - (a) Internal: 100 feet.
 - (b) Corner: 100 feet.
 - (3) Minimum lot depth: 100 feet.
 - (4) Minimum depth of front setback: 25 feet.
 - (5) Minimum depth of rear setback shall be 10 feet. There shall be no encroachment or overhangs into this required rear yard.
 - (6) Minimum width of side setback:
 - (a) Internal lot: 10 feet.
 - (b) Corner lot: 15 feet.
 - (7) Maximum building coverage as a percentage of lot area: 50%.
 - (8) Maximum accessory building coverage as a percentage of rear yard: 30%.
 - (9) Maximum height of structures: 45 feet or 3 stories, whichever is less.
 - (10) See §§ 153.050 through 153.060 for further clarification and exceptions and modifications.

Discussion And Possible Action On Entering Into An Agreement With Greater Northeast Little League For The Use Of Land Owned By The City Of Kirby For Little League Baseball Athletic Functions

This item was postponed on December 1st.

LICENSE AGREEMENT

This License Agreement is made by and between the City of Kirby (hereinafter called "City") and the Greater Northeast Little League, Inc. (hereinafter called "Licensee").

<u>1. License:</u> City hereby grants a non-exclusive license to Licensee for the use of a tract of land owned by the City of Kirby and located within the corporate limits of the City and described as follows:

Fields located at 5745 Binz Engleman CB 5092 P-13B ABS 134

<u>2. Use:</u> Licensee may use the Property for the purpose of conducting athletic functions sponsored by Licensee to include a Little League Baseball Program (as that term is recognized by the State and National Little League Organization).

The City has the right to schedule tournaments and functions throughout the year and will give Licensee a notice in advance of one month. The City will not schedule a tournament on a date that interferes with a previous scheduled little league event.

It is the desire of the City that as many children as possible have the opportunity to participate in the athletic programs of Licensee. It is therefore agreed that Licensee will operate a Baseball Program under official rules and regulations of Little League Baseball, Inc., Williamsport, Pennsylvania, and under the rules and regulations established by Licensee's Board of Directors.

- IT IS EXPRESSLY UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED THAT LICENSEE SHALL INDEMNIFY AND HOLD CITY HARMLESS FROM ANY LIABILITY FOR PAYMENT OF ANY OBLIGATIONS DUE TO ANY IMPROVEMENTS OR OTHER THINGS PLACED IN OR UPON SAID PREMISES BY LICENSEE. LICENSEE SHALL NOT ENCUMBER, IN ANY MANNER, NOR PERMIT A LIEN OF ANY TYPE TO BE PLACED ON SAID PREMISES, AND LICENSEE AGREES TO INDEMNIFY AND HOLD HARMLESS CITY CONCERNING ANY SUCH FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS, LIENS, OR ENCUMBRANCES OF ANY KIND.
- 3. Term and Utilities: The term of this License is for 2 years beginning January 1, 2023 and terminating December 31, 2024, provided that City may at any time terminate this License and take possession of the Property without being guilty in any manner of trespass; and every claim for damages for and by reason of such re-entry are hereby expressly waived by Licensee. It is understood that if the City terminates this Agreement for any reason, Licensee shall be given a hearing before the City Council prior to the effective date of such action to discuss such termination.
- 4. Rent: Licensee shall pay City rent in the amount of \$_____ per year, payable annually on or before January 15th of each year during the term of this License.

- 5. Improvements to Property: It is further agreed that the City Council shall have the right to approve all plans and specifications before any improvements are made to the Property by Licensee, other than normal maintenance, and Licensee shall submit all such plans and specifications to the City Council for review and approval. Upon termination or expiration of this Agreement, Licensee shall have the right to remove all physical improvements placed upon the Property by Licensee, provided that Licensee shall repair any damage to the Premises resulting from said removal.
- 6. Concession Stand: Licensee shall be permitted to operate a concession stand on the Premises and shall be permitted to sell merchandise and non-alcoholic beverages during Little League functions for the period from one (1) hour immediately before said function commences until one (1) hour immediately after said function. The concession stand will not be allowed to operate during the City of Kirby July 4th event. Licensee shall provide adequate and suitable containers for collecting discarded cups, papers, and trash from the operation of said concession stand and shall be responsible for keeping the entire Premises free of all paper, cups, and trash resulting from the operation of said concession stand. The City of Kirby has the right to sell concessions at the same time of the little league if another City sponsored sport or function is going on at the same time of a scheduled little league game. At no time shall Licensee sell or allow the sale of beer, wine, or any other alcoholic beverage.
- 7. Equal Opportunity: It is agreed and understood between the parties hereto that the Premises owned by the City are the subject of the contract and that in the conduct of Licensee's operation thereon, discrimination on account of race, color, sex, religion, age, disability, or national origin, directly or indirectly, is strictly prohibited.

8. Maintenance and Responsibility:

- a) It is understood that Licensee will maintain in a good condition all property furnished to it by the City and further that Licensee will maintain the Premises in a condition satisfactory to City. If the fields are in need of mowing, the City will notify Licensee that the fields must be mowed within 10 days of receipt of such notice. If fields are not mowed by Licensee within 10 days of Licensee receipt of such notice, the City may mow the fields and Licensee shall pay the City fee of \$150.00 each time the City mows the fields where Licensee fails to do so after receiving notice from the City that the fields need to be mowed. If Licensee fails to make such payment within 10 days of receipt of an invoice from the City, Licensee will be in default under this Agreement.
- b) In return for services rendered by Licensee to the youth of City, City will provide such maintenance that requires the use of heavy equipment. Such equipment shall be operated ONLY by a City employee and such maintenance shall be authorized by the City Manager ONLY, and scheduled by his/her designated representative. Other maintenance by City shall be at the discretion of the City Council upon written request by the City Manager.

- 9. Advertising: All advertising shall be maintained in a state of good repair. All fence signs shall be removed at the end of the regular Little League season.
- 10. Annual Report and Financial Statement: It is agreed that Licensee shall furnish to City, through the City Manager, a financial statement of the past year's operation by October 15th of each year. Said financial statement shall contain the same information as is furnished in Licensee's Annual Report to the National Little League Headquarters. If said annual report is not submitted, said financial statement shall contain the following information:
- a. Value of physical improvements placed on the Property
- b. Statement of assets and liabilities
- c. Disbursement of physical improvements
- d. Disbursements for utilities, itemized as to water, electricity, and gas
- e. Number of children in league
- f. Gross receipts from advertising sold
- g. Gross receipts from all donations
- h. Gross receipts from concessions
- i. Disbursements for concessions
- j. All other receipts and disbursements
- k. A complete inventory of all Greater Northeast Little League equipment used within the concession stand

The League Treasurer must, upon written request by the City Manager, furnish the League Bank balance within ten (10) days of such written request.

11. Insurance and Indemnification: As a condition precedent to the use of the Premises, Licensee agrees to indemnify and hold harmless City, its officials, employees, and agents from and against any and all costs, claims, and damages (including attorney's fees) that may be caused by the use of said Property, and shall protect and indemnify City from any and all claims costs, expenses, judgments, and causes of action arising out of the use of said Property, and shall defend (through legal counsel acceptable to the City) any litigation arising in connection with such use, all at Licensee's sole cost and expense. In addition, Licensee agrees to obtain an insurance policy protecting City from any liability and to have City named as co-insured in said policy. Such policy shall be for not less than \$500,000.00 per person for bodily injuries, not less than \$50,000.00 for property damage, and an aggregate limit of not less than \$1,000,000.00 per occurrence. Proof of payment of premium for said policy (and evidence of the existence of said policy) shall be

delivered to and kept by the City Secretary of City and such insurance policy shall be maintained in full force by Licensee so long as this Agreement is in effect.

- 12. Non-Profit Status: The Licensee shall have on file at City Hall a completed application for non-profit civic organization status for the City of Kirby, signed and approved by the City Manager.
- 13. Sublicense: Licensee may not assign its rights under this license or sublicense the Property without the prior express consent of the City Council as evidenced by a resolution adopted at a regular or special meeting of the City Council of Kirby.
- 14. Severability: Each section, subsection, provision, requirement, regulation or restriction established by this Agreement is hereby declared to be independent, and the holding of any part to be unconstitutional, invalid, or ineffective for any cause, shall not affect or render invalid this agreement or amendments hereto as a whole or any part thereof, except the particular part so declared to be invalid.
- 15. Entire Agreement: This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the City and the Licensee concerning the use of the Property.
- <u>16. Amendments:</u> This Agreement may be amended only by a written amendment executed on behalf of the parties hereto.
- <u>17. Counterparts:</u> This Agreement may be executed in counterparts which, when taken together, constitute one and the same agreement.
- 18. Facsimiles: This Agreement may be executed by a facsimile signature or a signature transmitted by facsimile and such signature shall be considered the same as an original signature for all purposes.

ORDINANCE NO. O. 2012 - 920

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRBY TEXAS AMENDING CHAPTER 150, BUILDING REGULATIONS, ARTICLE II BUILDING CONSTRUCTION CODE, SECTION 15.016 LOCAL AMENDMENTS OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES, BY ADOPTING AMENDMENTS TO THE MINIMUM SQUARE FOOTAGE THAT REQUIRES A SPRINKLER SYSTEM FOR CERTAIN OCCUPANCIES REPEALING ALL PRIOR ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Texas Local Governmental Code empowers the cities to enact codes and regulations and provide for their administration, enforcement, and amendment for the various elements of construction and development with the city; and

WHEREAS, the regulation of construction and development through the adoption of standardized codes with local amendments by the City of Kirby (the "City") is necessary to protect the public health, safety and welfare; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City desires to protect the safety and welfare of the citizens of the City through regulation of construction activities and safety compliance in the City; and

WHEREAS, the City has previously adopted multiple international codes; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has undertaken a review of the newly adopted international codes and local amendments as compared to the City's existing occupancy types and building uses; and

WHEREAS, City Council desires to adopt additional amendments to the local amendments to the international codes provided for herein as they pertain to regulations and requirements for automated sprinkler systems; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that the regulation of construction activities in the City, as set forth herein, is in the best interests of the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRBY, TEXAS:

Section 1. Chapter 150 of the City Code of the City of Kirby, Texas is hereby amended as set forth in the attached Exhibit A, incorporated herein.

Section 2. Any person, firm, corporation or agent who shall violate a provision of the amended Chapter shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and such persons shall be considered guilty of a separate offense for each and every day or portion thereof during which any violation of any of the provisions of this chapter is committed or continued, and upon conviction of any such violation such person shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$2,000.00 for each offense, in accordance with Section 10.99 of the City of Kirby Code of Ordinances.

EXHIBIT A

CHAPTER 150: BUILDING REGULATIONS; ARTICLE II. BUILDING CONSTRUCTION CODE; SECTION 150.16-LOCAL AMENDMENTS, IS HEREBY AMENDED AS FOLLOWS:

[Deletions are shown as strikethrough and additions are shown as underscore. No other amendments have been made, the remainder is shown for context.]

§ 150.16 LOCAL AMENDMENTS TO BUILDING CODE.

Certain provisions and portions of the International Building Code, 2018 Edition, are hereby amended as they apply to activities within the City. The amendments to the International Building Code, 2018 Edition, are as follows:

(A) Sections 103.1 and 103.2 are amended to read as follows:

Section 103.1 Deleted.

Section 103.2 Building official.

The building official shall be appointed by the City Manager.

(B) Section 114.4 is amended to read as follows:

114.4. Violations; penalty.

Any person who shall violate a provision of the code adopted by this article, or fail to comply therewith, or with any of the requirements thereof, or who shall erect, construct, alter, demolish or move any structure, or has erected, constructed, altered, repaired, moved, or demolished a building or structure in violation of a detailed statement or drawing submitted and approved thereunder shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction of any such violation, such person shall be punished by a fine not to be *less than \$500 and not more than \$2,000*. The owner or owners of any building or premises or part thereof, where anything in violation of this article shall be placed or shall exist, and any architect, builder, contractor, agent, person or corporation employed in connection therewith and who may have assisted in the commission of any such violation shall be guilty of a separate offense and upon conviction shall be fined as herein provided. Each day a violation occurs shall be a separate offense.

- (C) Delete Section 903, replace with the following:
 - (1) Henceforth automatic sprinkler systems must be installed throughout all levels of all new Group A, B, E, F, H, I, M, R-1, R-2, R-4 and S occupancies as defined in the International Building Code (IBC) of more than 2,500 12,000 square feet and throughout all R-3 occupancies as defined in said International Building Code of more than 5,000 12,000 square feet. The calculated area shall include all habitable space as well as the area of attached garages or storage facilities. Such systems shall be in accordance with Section 903 of the International Building Code as well as National Fire Protection Association Standards 13D and 13R, 2002 edition, for single-family dwellings.
 - (2) The following exceptions are hereby established:
 - (a) Detached gazebos and armadas for residential and public use. Independent buildings such as restrooms or snack shops 400 square feet or less without cooking or heating appliances that are associated with golf courses, parks and similar uses.

xvii. pool and billiard halls
xviii, waiting areas in transportation terminals

(3) Retrofit.

- (a) Building additions that equal 50 percent or more of the existing building floor area, or building additions that exceed 10,000 square feet regardless of percentage increase.
- (b) Two or more building permits, related to area increase, are issued over any 3 consecutive years.
- (c) One or more additions are made to an R-3 occupancy and the new total area of the building exceeds 5,000 square feet.
- (d) Building remodels that require structural changes affecting the primary structural system of the existing building.


