



STAGE 3

Stage Three restrictions may begin when the 10-day rolling average of the Aquifer level reaches 640 feet mean sea level at the monitored well. Coming out of drought stages can be considered 15 days after the aquifer is above the trigger.

- All restrictions from <u>Stage 1</u> and <u>Stage</u>
 2 remain in effect unless added to or replaced by Stage 3 rules.
- Watering with drip irrigation is allowed every Monday, Wednesday, and Friday, but only from 7-11 a.m. and 7-11 p.m.
- Watering with a hand-held hose is allowed any time on any day.
- All residential fountains and indoor commercial fountains can operate at any stage of drought.
- All non-public swimming pools must have a minimum of 25 percent of the surface area covered when not in use. Inflatable pool toys or floating decorations may be used for this purpose.
- Washing impervious cover such as parking lots, driveways, streets or sidewalks is prohibited. Health and safety exceptions may be requested from City of Kirby.
- Residential car washing allowed during drought once per week on Saturday or Sunday as long as there is no water waste.

Landscape watering allowed only **every other week** with an irrigation system, sprinkler or soaker hose from **7-11 a.m.** and **7-11 p.m.** on your designated watering day, as determined by your address.

Landscape Watering

Last Digit of Street Address	Watering Day
0 or 1	Monday
2 or 3	Tuesday
4 or 5	Wednesday
6 or 7	Thursday
8 or 9	Friday

No watering on weekends with a sprinkler, soaker hose or irrigation system. Areas without a street address, such as medians and neighborhood entryways water on Wednesday.

And don't forget to follow these year-round rules:

- Water waste is prohibited at all times. This includes lawn watering overspray and runoff.
- Restaurants may serve water only on request (to reduce dishwashing).
- <u>Charity car washes</u> allowed only at commercial car wash facilities.



The use of treated wastewater or recycled water is a defense to prosecution under these rules. Stage Three restrictions continue until there is an announcement in the newspaper that State Three has been canceled or that Stage Four is in effect.
